**“Nothing is impossible with
God.”**

'Jesus said, "Everything is possible for him who believes"
Immediately the boy's father exclaimed, "I do believe; help
me overcome my unbelief"' Mark 9: 23,24'
'Nothing is impossible with God' Luke 1:37

We live in a world that is limited by our belief in the 'possible',
and that further limited by our reliance on logic. By limiting our
belief to the 'possible', we are effectively saying that we do not
need God to intervene as we have the situation under control.
The man in Mark 9 had pinned all his hopes on Jesus
disciples healing his son who had been afflicted since he was
a little boy, and now that Jesus disciples couldn't heal him,
there seemed to be no hope left. Perhaps the man hadn't
recognised Jesus Lordship until He spoke to him but Jesus
words to him lifted the scales of unbelief from his eyes and as
he cried out "Lord I believe!" Jesus healed his son.

This man had demonstrated immense faith by seeking Jesus
out in the first place, but when he faced setbacks due to the
disciples inability to drive out the demons, he found himself
questioning that belief, which brought it home to him that there
was nowhere left to turn. In front of Jesus, unable to hide that
conflict of faith, he cried out in his honesty and essentially
confessed his sin of unbelief.

Believing that God can do the impossible is one thing, walking
through that scenario is quite another. We all waver between
belief and unbelief as the sheer enormity of our need
overwhelms us.

Perhaps you are waiting for God to answer a monumental
request at the moment and you find yourself in that
contradictory frame of mind. Ask God to forgive your unbelief
and wait for Him to rescue you.
